# How to utilize Library and Increase reading skills


Library is a repository of resources. It is an integral part of the educational system whose primary function is to serve users (students, faculty, researchers and staff). Computers and related electronic resources have come to play a central role in education. Electronic resources are the prime ingredients and they become a common part of the suite of most academic library resources today. The academic libraries often prefer electronic resources to substitute print collections for optimum use. Many reasons including physical space, escalation in journals' prices, digital literacy, discovery system, and skilled manpower force the academic libraries to opt for electronic resources in meeting needs of the large community of users. A lot of efforts have been taken in past few years to overcome this problem of financial crunch by resource sharing through consortia for university libraries. UGCINFONET, INDEST-AICTE Consortium and N-LIST are three major initiatives for universities and college library users. These revolutionary steps are providing scholarly resources including peer reviewed journals, databases, abstracts proceedings etc. These efforts must be a boon to library users which will definitely boost the level of higher education system in our country.

The N-LIST project provides access to e-resources to students, researchers and faculty from colleges and other beneficiary institutions through server(s) installed at the INFLIBNET Centre. The authorized users from colleges can now access e-resources and download articles required by them directly from the publisher's website once they are duly authenticated as authorized users through servers deployed at the INFLIBNET Centre.

The NDLI provides open access and freely available e-content on subject domains such as technology, social science, literature, law, medical, and so on. The NDLI provides e-learning resources in different types, e.g. books, articles, audio and video lectures, lecture presentation, question papers, newspapers, biography, theses, monographs, datasets, conference proceedings, animation, simulation, and so on. The NDLI provides educational material by integrating with digital repositories of a huge number of educational and research institutions in India. The NDLI provides user-interface support for browsing and accessing e-content in English, Hindi, Bengali, and other most widely used Indian languages.

DELNET- Developing Library Network, New Delhi is a major resource sharing library Network in India connecting more than 8800 institutions in 28 States and 6 Union Territories in India and few other countries comprising of Universities, Colleges, R&D organizations, medical hospitals, etc. It aims to collect, store, and disseminate information besides offering computerized services to users, to coordinate efforts for suitable collection development and also to reduce unnecessary duplication wherever possible.

Library is a place where the learner develops communication skills by enhancing their reading skills. They learn new words, new languages and thus enhance their vocabulary. They use resources (Print and media) which help them to improve their listening, reading and speaking skills.


